The group consisted of Civic leaders as well as law enforcement personnel.

BALLOT INITIATIVES UPDATE

The following is a review of the propositions on the June ballot and the election results.

Proposition 68: Authorizes Bonds Funding Parks, Natural Resources Protection, Climate Adaptation, Water Quality and Supply, and Flood Protection. CRP Oppose; however, voters said yes to the bond issue.

Proposition 69: Requires that certain new transportation revenues be used for transportation purposes. CRP was neutral; **voters said yes.**

Proposition 70: requires legislative supermajority vote approving use of cap-and-trade reserve fund. CRP Oppose; **voters said no.**

Proposition 71: Sets effective date for ballot measures. CRP Support; **voters said yes.**

Proposition 72: Permits legislature to exclude newly constructed raincapture systems from Property-tax reassessment requirement. CRP Support; **voters said yes.**

It appears that the voters of California were pretty much in line with the Republican philosophy except for the **Bond issue.**
