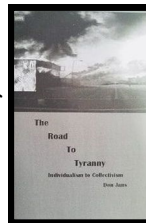

DO IT YOURSELF RESTAURANT

The following is an excerpt from Jeffries Journal, April 2019. (Supervisor Kevin Jeffries, First District)

For the past several years, brick & mortar restaurants have been keeping a watchful eye on the growing popularity of food trucks in Riverside County. Some of the restaurant owners found that it made good business sense to operate both a restaurant and a food truck.

Now comes another state approved entry into the retail food fight: Home based restaurants! State Assembly Bill 626 was signed into law in September 17, 2018 by then Governor Jerry Brown, which provides for retail food sales directly from home-based kitchens. If you love the concept of giving new entrepreneurs a chance at the American dream, this bill (and food) is for you! But if you want to make sure the food you buy and consume is as safe as it can be... well.... this budding home kitchen industry might not be for you.

Your County Environmental Health Department will NOT be allowed (by State law) to inspect and regulate this new industry like it does restaurants and food trucks. The home-based kitchen can only be subjected to one (1) regular inspection per year and it must be scheduled in advance, and if the Health Department receives public complaints about bad food or sanitary issues – the resulting onsite investigation must also be scheduled in advance with the operator. Home based kitchen businesses are also NOT going to have letter grades, so caveat emptor!

For those of you who enjoy the road-side food truck menus, just make sure the truck/trailer/stand has both a County health permit and a letter grade posted in plain sight. You'll be rewarding the businesses that are doing it the right way, and your stomach will thank you later!

KEEPING PARENTS IN THE KNOW ABOUT THEIR CHILDREN'S EDUCATION

When it comes to sex education, parents should have easy access to the information their children are learning. It is a responsibility owed to parents who are best able to determine when their children are ready to have these sensitive conversations.

While many parents are aware that health classes covering sex are taught in middle school and high school, they may not know that in California, school districts can also adopt curriculum for elementary-age students.

In some parts of the state, concerns have arisen because of an absence of clear communication from district officials about the instructional materials.

Parents have the right to know what lessons are being covered in the classroom. We want them to be engaged and involved in the education of their children and that requires transparency and accessibility.

To that end, I have introduced [SB 673](#), a bill brought to me by a concerned parent

That aims to empower families with information on this curriculum.

It would do the following:

Require school districts that adopt elementary-age comprehensive sexual health and HIV prevention curriculum to **make the materials available on their websites.**

Restore the right of parents of elementary-age students to **opt their children in to** comprehensive sexual health and HIV prevention education courses, rather than passively opt-out.

Require any district-adopted sexual education curricula for elementary-age children to be both age-appropriate and medically accurate, as is required of middle school and high school curricula.

EASTER

Easter, which celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead, is Christianity's most important holiday. It has been called a moveable feast because it doesn't fall on a set date every year, as most holidays do. Instead, Christian churches in the West celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the full moon after the vernal equinox on March 21. Therefore, Easter is observed anywhere between March 22 and April 25 every year.

The exact origins of this religious feast day's name are unknown. Some sources claim the word Easter is derived from Eostre, a Teutonic goddess of spring and fertility. Other accounts trace Easter to the Latin term hebdomada alba, or white week, an ancient reference to Easter week and the white clothing donned by people who were baptized during that time. Through a translation error, the term later appeared as esostarum in Old High German, which eventually became Easter in English. In Spanish, Easter is known as Pascua; in French, Paques. These words are derived from the Greek and Latin Pascha or Pasch, for Passover.



ONCE IN A BLUE MOON!

It is those intercalated days, by the way, that make possible the phenomenon of the "blue moon." Usually there is just one full moon per month, but should it fall in the first three days of a 31-day month or the first two days of a 30-day month, you can have two full moons in one month; the second is the one known as the blue moon.

This generally happens only once a year, giving rise to the expression "once in a blue moon," meaning a rare occurrence. Even more unusual is to have two blue moons in one year, something that happens only if the first full moon of the year falls on January 1. So if something is as rare as hen's teeth, better say, "twice in blue moons."
