FEBRUARY, A HISTORICAL MONTH

Four presidents were born in February:

George Washington, Federalist; February 22, 1732 – December 14, 1799 was the first President of the United States from 1789 to 1797 and was one of the Founding Fathers of the United States.

William Henry Harrison Sr., Whig, (February 9, 1773 – April 4, 1841) was the ninth President of the United States (1841), and died 31 days into his term.

Abraham Lincoln, Republican, February 12, 1809 – April 15, 1865) was the 16th President of the United States from March 1861 until his assassination in April 1865. He was the first Republican President after the founding of the Party.

Ronald Wilson Reagan, Republican, February 6, 1911 – June 5, 2004 was the 40th President of the United States, from 1981 to 1989. Before his presidency, he was the 33rd Governor of California, from 1967 to 1975.

FEBRUARY—BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Black History Month has its origin in 19th Century celebrations of **Lincoln's** Birthday by African-American communities in the United States. By the

early 20th Century, black communities were annually celebrating Lincoln's birthday in conjunction with the birthday of former slave and abolitionist Frederick Douglass on February 14.

The precursor to Black History Month was created in 1926 when historian Carter G. Woodson and the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History announced that the second week of February would be "Negro History Week" to coincide with the commemorations of both men's birthdays.

FEBRUARY

Having only 28 days in common years, it is the only month of the year that can pass without a single full moon. This last happened in 2018.

February is also the only month of the calendar that, once every six years and twice every 11 years consecutively either back into the past or forward into the future, will have four full 7-day weeks. This year has four full 7-day weeks!!!
