## Publicity Director, Gary Hill

Gary and Carolyn have lived in the Villages since 1984! That must be some kind of record! That was back when the minimum age was 45, not 55, in case you are doing the math. Gary served on the Association Board of Directors for years 2003 through 2006 - Secretary of the Board for three of those years.

Gary was a founding member of the Republican Club, which was officially organized in 1998. Gary reports that our own Donna Roberson started the Club, converting it from a Women's organization, as it had originally been formatted. (I wonder how many women she lost upon conversion!) Donna currently serves as Co-Chair of Reservations/Menu for our monthly meetings – remember those?) Gary has served two terms as President of the Club and is currently Publicity Director.

Gary began his 42-year work career as a Production Engineer, making nuclear reactors for submarines, such as the Polaris. He retired after 35 years with United Technologies. "It's not rocket science," but Gary was Director of the Titan IV Solid Rocket Booster Program, a \$2.5 billion program for launching military satellites from Cape Canaveral and Vandenberg Air Force Base.

Gary graduated from Colorado School of Mines with a degree in Metallurgical Engineering and did post-graduate studies at Carnegie-Mellon Institute in Pittsburg, Pennsylvania.

## New York Times 1619 Project

In a speech on July 16, 2020 Secretary of State Mike Pompeo declared that the American way of life is "under attack" and accused the New York Times of promoting "Marxist" ideology with its controversial "1619 Project."

According to the Times (i.e., by its own admission\*,) the 1619 Project "aims to reframe the country's history by placing the consequences of slavery and the contributions of black Americans at the very center of our national narrative."

Pompeo went on to say "The New York Times' 1619 project, so named for the year the first slaves were transported to America, wants you to believe that our county was founded <u>for</u>\* human bondage. They want you to believe that America's institutions continue to reflect the country's acceptance of slavery at our founding. They want you to believe the Marxist ideology that America is only (consists only of\*) the oppressors and the oppressed," he said.

"The Chinese Communist Party must be gleeful when they see the New York Times spout this ideology," he said.

He went on to say that those who are pulling down statues and desecrating monuments have a "dark vision of America's birth." "I reject it; it's a disturbed reading of America's history; it is a slander of our great people. Nothing could be further from the truth of our founding."

#### Bari Weiss on the "Cancel Culture"

Recently resigned New York Times opinion editor Bari Weiss and Harper's Magazine columnist Thomas Chatterton Williams appeared on "Real Time with Bill Maher" recently to explain the open letter they penned decrying "cancel culture." The letter was signed by other prominent liberals, as well, including "Harry Potter" author J.K. Rowling, political activist Noam Chomsky, and feminist icon Gloria Steinem. They were all defending open debate without fear of repercussions.

The letter faced heavy criticism from the left, as Bill Maher noted. "What strikes me about it," he said "is the pushback is coming from liberals and almost everyone who signed this letter ... is a liberal!"

Weiss called the open letter a "warning cry from inside the institutions" and coined the phrase "Culture of <u>illiberalism</u>," which of course we on the right have been decrying for some time. The Cal Berkeley campus that gave rise to Mario Savio and the "Free Speech Movement" back in 1960s will no longer tolerate visiting conservative speakers.

## IN THE NEWS, CONT'D

#### Weiss said that:

- ✓ Politics has become a "religious identity" for many Americans, pointing to how on the left, "To be anything less than 'Defund the police'... makes you something like a heretic."
- ✓ It's about punishing the person for being insufficiently pure."
- ✓ "If conversation with people that we disagree with becomes impossible, what is the way that we solve conflict?... It's violence." (If there is a conservative version of "wokeness," Bari Weiss just found it!)

## Steve Hilton and "Rope-a-Dope"

"The Next Revolution" host Steve Hilton urged the Trump campaign recently to "turn up the tempo," expressing concerns over their "baffling complacency" that he fears will result in a Joe Biden victory this November. "Where is the energy?" he asked. "Where are the ideas in the hope for the future?" "They seem to be sleepwalking into a Biden presidency."

I suspect that President Trump is using the old "rope-a-dope" technique made famous by Muhammed Ali. As explained by Wikipedia, "rope-a-dope" describes a strategy in which a boxer lets his opponent fatigue himself by drawing non-injuring offensive punches. This then gives the boxer an advantage as the opponent becomes tired, allowing him to execute devastating offensive maneuvers and thereby win.

In the case of Trump versus Biden, it is more about letting Biden and the media have a false sense of security, letting them drift further and further left, letting them have enough rope to hang themselves, and then coming back "with a vengeance." Trump is a hard closer and a devastating counterpuncher. He's got Biden and the media right where he wants them. (I think; I hope!)

#### Senator Ted Cruz on the Radical Left

After chairing a Senate Judiciary subcommittee hearing, Senator Ted Cruz had this to say August 4 on "Hannity":

- > "Democrats are 'facilitating' riots and violence in major American cities and encouraging 'radical leftists' who are threatening Americans."
- "What's happening, unfortunately, is not free speech, and those who are peaceably protesting are seeing their protests hijacked by violent anarchists, by Marxists who are engaged in acts of terror."
- ➤ "Seven Democrats spoke and questioned the witnesses. *Not a single one dared to criticize Antifa in any way...* they want to encourage these radical leftists."
- "Most of the party is really held captive to the extreme angry voices, whether it's Antifa, whether ... it is AOC or Bernie Sanders or Elizabeth Warren. And you see them denying reality. You'll also see them using rhetoric, I mean, calling federal police officers 'storm troopers' like Nancy Pelosi did, or 'Gestapo,' as Clyburn did ... Cops are not Nazis, and it is grotesque. It is offensive."

Facebook was thoughtful enough to flag this image as part of its efforts to "combat false news and misinformation on its News Feed." I'm sure we are all grateful. PolitiFact gave the image a "half true" because Melania's staff had grown from 4 when the statement was made to 10 most recently (still the smallest staff since Mamie Eisenhower.) The other three elements of the image were all true. That alone (3 out of 4) would make it 75% true. Add the fact that the number 4 was accurate when the image went viral, and we can say that it was 100% true at the time, and is true in spirit now.
