Hemet San Jacinto Congress of Republicans membership runs from January to December. This will get you a monthly newsletter, a directory, and notification of any political events in the Valley.



The following isn't experienced in downtown Hemet; however, HSJCR members travel the freeway and some of the roads impacted by tractor-trailer trucks servicing warehouses along the I215 corridor.

Tractor-Trailer Trucks. The professional drivers of those big trucks need to make a living like the rest of us, but as more and more of us are ordering online (which as we all know hurts the brick and mortar stores), some of those truck drivers are "finding" new travel routes to avoid the freeway gridlock, and some of those routes are on streets that were never intended to handle the traffic or weight of those big trucks.

I've taken a hard line on the proposed megawarehouses along the 215 freeway the latest approved over my objection will be 2,022,364 square feet, because we do NOT have the freeway capacity needed. If they did, they wouldn't be cutting through neighborhood streets. We have been successful in limiting truck traffic on a few small residential streets, but state law doesn't easily allow us to keep them off roads like Van Buren Blvd. and Cajalco.
