

Understanding how all that works, the laws, logistics and the massive undertaking is important in obtaining the trust and confidence of the voters.

I have been arguing that the County needs to develop a Citizens Committee on Election Integrity to help build that trust and confidence by including members of the public and political groups of all stripes in the process and discussing the policies and safeguards that are in place, and how they might be improved.

Our Registrar of Voters (ROV) has been described as a walking encyclopedia of election law who has a great team or core of professionals helping run the ROV. But if the voters don't trust the results or simply lack confidence or knowledge in the process, it's all for naught.

Recently, the County Executive Team was directed by the full Board to return with a comprehensive proposal to engage, educate, and open lines of communications between the ROV and interested parties/citizens.

#### **SEPTEMBER 11, 2001**

Where were you and what were you doing at 8:45 a.m. on September 11, 2001? Twenty years later the American people saw many memorials and tributes to those who did not survive the tragedy. In the past few days, we have read accounts and heard the thoughts of the survivors as they share their memories.

On September 11, 2001, 19 militants associated with the Islamic extremist group al-Qaeda hijacked four airplanes and carried out suicide attacks against targets in the United States. Almost 3,000 people were killed during the 9/11 terrorist attacks, which triggered major U.S. initiatives to combat terrorism and defined the presidency of George W. Bush.

At 8:45 a.m. on a clear Tuesday morning, an American Airlines Boeing 767 loaded with 20,000 gallons of jet fuel crashed into the north tower of the World Trade Center.

As the evacuation of the tower and its twin got underway, television cameras broadcasted live images of what initially appeared to be a freak accident. Then, 18 minutes after the first plane hit, a second appeared out of the sky and sliced into the south tower. The U.S. was under attack.

As millions watched the events unfolding in New York, American Airlines Flight 77 circled over downtown Washington, DC before crashing into the west side of the Pentagon military headquarters at 9:45 a.m. Jet fuel from the Boeing 757 caused a devastating inferno that led to the structural collapse of a portion of the giant concrete building, headquarters of the Department of Defense.

A fourth California-bound plane was hijacked about 40 minutes after leaving an airport in New Jersey. Because the plane had been delayed, passengers on board learned of events in New York and Washington via cell phone and airfone calls to the ground. Knowing that the aircraft was not returning to an airport as the hijackers claimed, a group of passengers and flight attendants planned an insurrection.

They fought the four hijackers and are suspected to have attached the cockpit with a fire extinguisher. The plane then flipped and sped toward the ground at upwards of 500 miles per hour crashing in a rural field killing 44 passengers.

Some of the terrorists had lived in the U.S. for more than a year and had taken flying lessons at American commercial flight schools. Others had slipped into the country in the months prior to September 11.

The question we face today is: "Could this happen again?"
