KEVIN PEARSON, EMWD, TO KEYNOTE MARCH MEETING

Kevin served on the Board of Directors of the Hemet San Jacinto Chamber of Commerce. Currently his family funds scholarship programs through the San Jacinto Education Foundation and supports Michelle's Place Cancer Resource Center in Temecula. He is a resident of the City of Menifee.

EASTERN MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT

The **Eastern Municipal Water District** of Southern California is a regional water district formed in 1950 to secure additional water for a largely rural area of western Riverside County. In addition to water service, responsibilities include sewage collection, water desalination and water recycling.

Since its formation in 1950, **Eastern Municipal Water District** (EMWD) has changed from a small, primarily agricultural-serving agency, to one whose major demands come from domestic customers.

Authorized under the Municipal Water District Act of 1911, EMWD's duties and responsibilities are further delineated in the California Water Code. In 1951, EMWD annexed to The Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD). EMWD employs approximately 614 employees.

DEMOCRATS HEAD FOR EXIT Newsmax. March 2022 page 34	JUDICIAL WATCH WARNS MORE COUNTIES TO CLEAN VOTER ROLLS OR FACE FEDERAL LAWSUITS The following is an excerpt from The Judicial Watch Verdict. Judicial Watch sent letters to election officials in 14 counties and five states — Arkansas, California, Illinois, new York and Oregon — notifying them of evident violations of the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 (NVRA). The NVRA requires states to conduct a general program that makes a reasonable effort to remove" from the official voter rolls "the names of ineligible voters" who have died or changed residence. Among other things, the NVRA requires registrations to be canceled when voters fail to respond to address-confirmation notices and then fail to vote in the next two general federal elections. In 2018, the Supreme Court confirmed that such removals are mandatory	
The number of Democrat congressmen retiring or seeking another office has passed 30. Now, nervous party insiders privately see the number of "voluntary" departures approaching 40—surpassing the 1992 figure, a modern "high." Common factors among this year's departing Democrats are that most have not been in the House very long and cited their distaste for the in-		
creasingly partisan nature of the House. In contrast, only 13 House Republicans have said they won't seek reelection—and that number, GOP sources told Newsmax, is not likely to change.
