| Day.<br>FATHER'S DAY<br>The first known Father's Day service occurred in Fairmont,<br>West Virginia, on July 5, 1908, after hundreds of men died in<br>the worst mining accident in U.S. history.<br>Grace Golden Clayton, the daughter of a dedicated<br>minister, proposed a service to honor all fathers, especially<br>those who had died. However, the observance did not become<br>an annual event, and it was not promoted; very few people<br>outside of the local area knew about it.
