Check-in for the June meeting is at 11 a.m. President Joanne will call the meeting to order at 11:30.

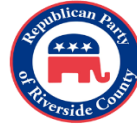

Republicans are planning to take advantage of the growing parents’ movement to have more say in students’ curricula. FLAG DAY



The Fourth of July was traditionally celebrated as America's birthday, but the idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the Flag is believed to have first originated in 1885. Bernard J. Cigrand held the first recognized formal observance of Flag Day at the Stony Hill School. The school has been restored, and a bust of Cigrand also honors him at the National Flag Day Americanism Center in Waubeka, Wisconsin where Cigrand worked as a grade school teacher.

From the late 1880s on, Cigrand spoke around the country promoting patriotism, respect for the flag, and the need for the annual observance of a flag day on June 14, the day in 1777 that the Continental Congress adopted the Stars and Stripes.

He moved to Chicago to attend dental school and, in June 1886, first publicly proposed an annual observance of the birth of the United States flag in an article titled "the Fourteenth of June," published in the Chicago Argus newspaper. Cigrand advocated establishing the holiday in a speech before the "Sons of America," a Chicago group. The organization founded a magazine, American Standard, in order to promote reverence for American emblems.

Cigrand became president of the American Flag Association. He once noted he had given 2,188 speeches on patriotism and the flag.

Flag Day was officially *established* by the proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on May 30, 1916. However, it was not until August 3, 1949 that President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14 of each year as National Flag Day.

FATHER'S DAY

The first known Father's Day service occurred in Fairmont, West Virginia, on July 5, 1908, after hundreds of men died in the worst mining accident in U.S. history.

Grace Golden Clayton, the daughter of a dedicated minister, proposed a service to honor all fathers, especially those who had died. However, the observance did not become an annual event, and it was not promoted; very few people outside of the local area knew about it. Meanwhile, across the entire country, another woman was inspired to honor fathers ...

In 1909, Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington, was inspired by Anna Jarvis and the idea of Mother's Day. Her father, William Jackson Smart, a farmer and Civil War veteran, was also a single parent who raised Sonora and her five brothers by himself, after his wife Ellen died giving birth to their youngest child in 1898. While attending a Mother's Day church service in 1909, Sonora, then 27 years old, came up with the idea.

Within a few months, Sonora had convinced the Spokane Ministerial Association and the YMCA to set aside a Sunday in June to celebrate fathers. She proposed June 5, her father's birthday, but the ministers chose the third Sunday in June so that they would have more time after Mother's Day (the second Sunday in May) to prepare their sermons.

Thus, on June 19, 1910, the first Father's Day events commenced: Sonora delivered presents to handicapped fathers, boys from the YMCA decorated their lapels with fresh-cut roses (red for living fathers, white for the deceased), and the city's ministers devoted their homilies to fatherhood.

HAPPY FATHERS' DAY

North America is not the only place where Father's Day is celebrated, of course:

- In traditionally Catholic countries such as Spain and Portugal, Father's Day is observed on March 19, the Feast of St. Joseph.
- The Taiwanese celebrate Father's Day on August 8—the eighth day of the eighth month—because the Mandarin Chinese word for eight sounds like the word for "Papa."
- In Thailand, Father's Day is celebrated on former King Bhumibol Adulyadej's birthday, December 5.

FLAG TRIVIA

The original stars and stripes that inspired Francis Scott Key to write "The Star Spangled Banner" is at the Smithsonian Museum in Washington, DC.

The current 50 star flag design was created by Robert G. Heft, a 17 year old high school student when he designed it.

There were 26 versions of the Stars and Stripes prior to the current one with 50 stars and 13 stripes.
