Ballot Drop: ballots will be sent from the Registrar of Voters on October 10. **Registration:** November 8 election registration closes on October 24.

Election Day November 8: ballots much be received by the elections official no later than the close of polls or be postmarked on or before election Day and received no later than seven days after Election Day to be counted. **A Statement of Results:** results will

be sent no later than November 28. **Officers take office:** elected officers take office on December 2, the first Friday in December next following the general district election.

To commemorate the event, Druids built huge sacred bonfires, where the people gathered to burn crops and animals as sacrifices to the Celtic deities. During the celebration, the Celts wore costumes, typically consisting of animal heads and skins, and attempted to tell each other's fortunes.
