Riverside County elected Congressmen Ken Calvert and Darrell Issa, State Senator Kelly Seyarto, and Assemblypersons Bill Essayli and Kate Sanchez.

It must be noted that Riverside County voted all Republican for the Constitutional Offices. We can be proud as registration is almost equally divided between Dems and Reps.

These mayors are turning their once-proud cities into basket cases and are candidates for the "worst mayor."

LaToya Cantrell, the mayor of New Orleans, is in the race for the nation's worst mayor because she has decimated city services.

There are only 957 cops left. The billions allocated by the federal government to rebuild city drainage systems after hurricane Katrina disappeared with nothing built.

The middle class that has fled The Big Easy is both Black and white and what's left isn't much of a city at all. Major fundraisers like Mardi Gras are run by people who live elsewhere.

A case for "worst mayor' could be made for Baltimore—given its high rates of illiteracy, crime, and utter dysfunction, which Mayor Randon Scott is doing little to reverse. The former mayor, Catherine Pugh just finished serving three years in jail.

Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot was looking like a sure winner, with escalating violent crime not just in low-income Black neighborhoods but also on the Miracle Mile, whose nicer stores were trashed during the 2020 looting with no arrests.

In 2021, 797 people were murdered, a number unseen for 25 years. She has aggressive, George Soros-supported District Attorney Kimberly Foxx to ensure that no one does time for any crime.

New York, under Mayor Bill DeBlasio, reversed the great public safety that Rudy Giuliani and Michael Bloomberg had created in the '90's and early 2000s.

The city's public transportation is now dangerous, especially for women. Streets are filthy, and violent crime is up 26 %...

The city is facing a spiraling economic downturn, and 9.5% of NYC school children have not returned to the public schools since they reopened.

Pipeline Project

EMWD has begun work on a project in French Valley off of Pourroy and Benton to install approximately 12,300 feet of recycled water pipeline. This will allow Emerald Park, Brookfield Park, Susan La Vorgna Elementary School, and other Valley Wide Recreation and Park District facilities to use recycled water instead of potable water for landscaping irrigation purposes.

Construction is set to be complete by Fall 2023. The community can expect working hours of 7:00 am to 4:00 pm and minor traffic delays. For more information, visit www.emwd.org/fvrwp.

PEARL HARBOR Sunday, December 7, 1941 DAY OF INFAMY

December 7, 1941— a day that will live in History the day that marked the United States' decision to enter WWII. There are fewer and fewer of Pearl Harbor survivors left to share their memories. Let's not forget what they endured.

The surprise attack took place on a peaceful Sunday morning of December 7, 1941 on the "paradise" island of Oahu. The time of the attack was a short or long two hours. The surprise military strike conducted by the Imperial Japanese Navy against the United States naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii was a preventive action in order to keep the U.S. Pacific Fleet from interfering with military actions the Empire of Japan was planning in Southeast Asia.

The destruction in two hours was phenomenal. The base was attached by 353 Japanese fighters, bombers and torpedo planes in two waves, launched from six aircraft carriers. All eight U.S. Navy battleships were damaged, with four being sunk. Of these eight damaged, two were raised, and with four repaired, six battleships returned to service later in the war. The Japanese also sank or damaged three cruisers, three destroyers, an anti-aircraft training ship, and one minelayer. There were 188 U.S. aircraft destroyed; 2,402 Americans were killed and 1,282 wounded.

Important base installations such as the power station, shipyard, maintenance, and fuel and torpedo storage facilities, as well as the submarine piers and headquarters building (also home of the intelligence section) were not attacked! The Pacific Fleet aircraft carriers remained intact.

Japanese losses were light: 29 aircraft and five midget submarines lost, and 65 servicemen killed or wounded. One Japanese sailor was captured.

The attack came as a profound shock to the American people and led directly to the American entry into World War II in both the Pacific and European theaters.

CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

Advent Calendar Origin: The Advent calendar provides 24 openings, one to be opened each day beginning December 1. According to tradition, the calendar was created in the 19th century by a Munich housewife who tired of having to answer endlessly when Christmas would come. The first commercial calendars were printed in Germany in 1851.

European Countries: In some European countries, St. Nicholas appears on his feast day (December 6) bringing modest gifts of candy and other gifts to children.

The Netherlands: Every year in the days leading up to December 25th, Dutch children eagerly place their shoes by the fire in hopes that Sinterklaas will fill them with small gifts and treats in the night. Traditionally, carrots are left in the shoes for Sinterklaas' faithful steed, a white horse named Amerigo. In the olden days, naughty children would receive a potato in lieu of gifts.

Sweden: In Sweden the Yule Goat is celebrated. The Yule Goat dates back to at least the 11th century, where there are mentions of a man-sized goat figure, led by Saint Nicholas, who had the power to control the devil.

In the 17th century, it was popular for young men to dress as the goat creature and run around pulling pranks and demanding gifts. By the 19th century, the goat became the good guy - a giver of gifts. Instead of Father Christmas, men in the family would dress up as the goat and give gifts to the entire family. Today, the Yule Goat has taken its place in modern history as a traditional Christmas ornament on trees.

Ukraine: Ukrainians forego tinsel and baubles, instead decorating their Christmas trees with an artificial spider and web. According to Ukrainian legend, a poor widow and her children grew a Christmas tree from a pine cone, then realized they did not have anything to decorate it with. When spiders heard the children crying, they decorated their tree with beautiful webs. The spider symbolizes good luck for the new year.

Italy: Forget Santa and December 25th when in Italy, as all the action takes place on the eve of January 5. According to folklore, an old woman named Belfana visits all the children of Italy to fill their stockings with candy and leave them presents if they've been good. Belfana enters through the chimney and is left treats by the children who live there - typically wine and local delicacies.

Ireland: In Ireland, an old tradition says to leave a tall candle on the sill of the largest window of the house. The candle is lit after sunset on Christmas Eve and is supposed to burn all night long—it represents a welcoming light for Mary and Joseph.

Norway: According to Norwegian folklore, Christmas Eve is the day when mischievous spirits and witches take to the skies for mischief and general tomfoolery. As witches often use brooms as their preferred mode of transportation, it's tradition for Norwegian families to hide away any sweeping sticks where the witches won't be able to find them.
