JONES ACT ARTICLE REBUTTAL

Last month an article was published regarding the Jones Act. I thank the member, Arvid Anderson, for sending a rebuttal from first hand Merchant Marine knowledge. (Charlene)

The Jones Act is called "protectionist" by its opponents. But, if we are going to apply a fair measuring rod to other industries, we would throw out farm subsidies, loan guarantees, and the whole clean energy industry and bank bailouts. Currently 80% of the world has "cabotage" laws regulating domestic waterborne traffic.

The Jones Act was designed to accomplish 3 goals. The first goal is to ensure a viable domestic fleet via exclusion of foreign ships from the domestic trade, ensuring that the US is not held hostage during an economic war, by foreign actors. The second goal is to insure that we have a viable shipbuilding industry to build our US naval vessels. The third goal of the Jones Act was to provide U.S. Merchant Seaman, with legal protection from unscrupulous owners and remedy in the event of illness or injury. The Merchant Sailor worldwide is paid ½ to ¼ of what U.S. sailors make, without legal protections. Non-US ships and crews are abandoned in foreign ports when the owner can no longer pay their bills.

American sailors are subject to Security background checks via the **TWIC** (Transportation Workers Identity Card) program. The use of a tanker or tank barge by a foreign actor to disrupt domestic water transportation would be catastrophic. A large spill, collision or grounding would disrupt marine traffic in the particular waterway for weeks.

J.P Morgan estimates that barge transport adds 10cents a gallon to east coast gas prices. As for Marine Transportation making our country more dependent on foreign oil, that is a "red herring". The Biden Administra- ₹ February 27: tions' stopping pipelines, reducing and

delaying lease sales, holding up permits on drilling and making it hard to drill on private land have raised gas and diesel price across the country. There is a concerted effort to raise the cost of all petroleum products and it's called "The Green New Deal".

Full Court Press... Last month, I reported on the on-going saga of our understaffed courts (lack of judges), and the growing number of criminal cases being dismissed before trial by the courts (which includes a large number of felony cases).

Our local ratio of judicial officers per 100,000 residents is 3.4, compared to a statewide average of 11.4. In short Riverside County is at least 22 judges short to handle the workload (assuming all of our judges are working full time 5 days a week).

The battle to fix this injustice (staffing) is now moving to the State Capital in Sacramento. Our local State Senator Richard Roth has introduced SB-75 to have the State fund the additional judges for our county and others. My guess this will be a brutal fight in the State Legislature. Our State is not exactly known for desiring to enhance the judicial branch anywhere in California.

As we hear more about this uphill effort, we may need to send letters to our legislators asking for support. More to come.

FEBRUARY, A HISTORICAL MONTH

Four presidents were born in February:

George Washington, **Federalist**; February 22, 1732 – December 14, 1799 was the first President of the United States from 1789 to 1797 and was one of the Founding Fathers of the United States.

William Henry Harrison Sr., Whig, (February 9, 1773 – April 4, 1841) was the ninth President of the United States (1841), and died 31 days into his term.

Abraham Lincoln, Republican, February 12, 1809 – April 15, 1865) was the 16th President of the United States from March 1861 until his assassination in April 1865. He was the first Republican President after the founding of the Party.

Ronald Wilson Reagan, Republican, February 6, 1911 – June 5, 2004 was the 40th President of the United States, from 1981 to 1989. Before his presidency, he was the 33rd Governor of California, from 1967 to 1975.

MEMORABLE FEBRUARY DATES

February 6: King George VI of England died. Upon his death, his daughter Princess Elizabeth became Queen Elizabeth II, Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

February 11: American inventor Thomas Edison (1847-1931) was born in Milan, Ohio. Throughout his lifetime he acquired over 1,200 patents including the incandescent bulb, phonograph and movie camera.

February 14: In 1929, the St. Valentine's Day massacre occurred in Chicago as seven members of the Bugs Moran gang were gunned down by five of Al Capone's mobsters posing as police.

February 15: Astronomer and physicist **Galileo Galilei (1564-1642)** was born in Pisa, Italy. He was the first astronomer to use a telescope and advanced the theory that the sun, not the earth, was the center of the solar system.

February 23, 1942: During World War II, the first attack on the U.S. mainland occurred as a Japanese submarine shelled an oil refinery near Santa Barbara. California, causing minor damage.

February 13, 1635 - Boston Latin School, the first tax-payer supported (public) school in America was established in Boston, Massachusetts.

February 16: Entertainer and politician Sonny Bono (1935-1998) was born in Detroit, Michigan. Following a career as a popular singer, he became mayor of Palm Springs, California, then became a Republican congressman, serving until his accidental death from a skiing mishap.
