#### RIVERSIDE COUNTY ASSEMBLYMAN ACCEPTS TRUMP APPOINTMENT

NAME(S)

On April 1, Assemblyman Bill Essayli, vacated his seat in the California State Assembly to accept the appointment to be the United States Attorney for the Central District of California.

"I am honored that President Trump and Attorney General Bondi have placed their trust in me to serve as United States Attorney for the Central District of California. I intend to implement the President's mission to restore trust in our justice system and pursue those who dare to cause harm to the United States and the People of our nation," stated Bill Essayli.

The United States Attorney's Office for the Central District of California serves the seven counties of Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, and Ventura. This includes a population of nearly 20 million people – the largest of any federal judicial district in the country. The role of the Office is to enforce the laws and defend the interests of the United States. It does so through three primary litigating Divisions: Criminal, National Security, and Civil.

#### 63 ASSEMBLY DISTRICT

The 63AD recently vacated by Assemblyman Bill Essavli is located in Riverside County. It takes in Canyon Lake, Corona (partial), Eastvale (partial), Lake Elsinore (partial), Menifee, Norco, and Riverside (partial). Essayli won his 2024 race with 58 percent of the vote and this is considered a Republican stronghold.

At this time one Democrat has jumped in the race and one Republican. Natasha Johnson, the Republican candidate, comes from a military family. She put down her permanent roots in Lake Elsinore 26 years ago. Currently, she serves on the Lake Elsinore city council and has served as mayor. She and her husband are proud parents of three sons: one college graduate, one in college, and one in high school.

Essayli has endorsed her candidacy.

#### FEDERAL FRAUD HITS \$1 TRILLION A YEAR

Government Accountability Congress' Office has estimated fraud losses at between \$233 billion and \$521 billion annually. But in testimony to Congress, risk management experts say the real figure is closer to \$1 trillion.

That's how much the federal government loses every year due to fraud, waste, and abuse.

While grants to the private sector typically experience a 3 % - 4% level of fraud or abuse, for federal spending it's an estimated 20%......Some recipients, analysts say, are simply no longer alive, but their survivors continue to milk taxpayers anyway.

Three simple steps could save federal, state, and local governments tens of billions of dollars every year:

- 2. Monitor the programs on the "back end" to be sure they're actually delivering promised benefits to the public.

Rep. Mike Collins, R-GA, warns that Chinese land purchases pose a national security threat, citing a 30 percent increase in Chinese-owned U.S. farmland since 2019. "There are dangerous loopholes that allow China to target our agricultural sector," Collins said, calling it economic warfare. He highlighted concerns that some land acquisitions are near military bases, raising security risks.

Collins has urged Congress to close loopholes and restrict foreign adversaries from buying strategic U.S. land, emphasizing the need to protect American resources from Chinese influence.

#### Did you know......

Excerpts from Confronting the Presidents. O'Reilly and Dugard.

Helen "Nellie" Taft got rid of the White House horse and buggy, insisting that the president travel by car. On March 27, 1912, she personally plants the first of three thousand cherry trees sent to Washington by the city of Tokyo, forever changing the capital landscape. In 1909, Taft purchases four vehicles for the White House: two Pierce-Arrows, a white Stanley Steamer, and a Baker electric.

First Lady Lucy Hayes is outgoing and fun loving. There is no money to remodel the White House, so she makes sure the furniture is arranged to cover the holes in the carpet. It is Lucy who oversees the addition of running water to the mansion. She also adds the first telephone, typewriter, and phonograph. The time is 1877-1881.

#### **EASTER**



Easter, which celebrates Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead, is Christianity's most important holiday. It has been called a moveable feast because it doesn't fall on a set date every year, as most holidays do.

Instead, Christian churches in the West celebrate Easter on the first Sunday following the full moon after the vernal equinox on March 21. Therefore, Easter is observed anywhere between March 22 and April 25 every year.

The exact origins of this religious feast day's name are unknown. Some sources claim the word Easter is derived from Eostre, a Teutonic goddess of spring and fertility. Other accounts trace Easter to the Latin term hebdomada alba, or white week, an ancient reference to Easter week and the white clothing donned by people who were baptized during that time. Through a translation error, the term later appeared as esostarum in Old High German, which eventually became Easter in English. In Spanish, Easter is known as Pascua; in French, Paques. These words are derived from the Greek and Latin Pascha or Pasch, for Passover.

#### **APRIL FOOL'S DAY**

Some historians speculate that April Fools' Day dates back to 1582, when France switched from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian calendar, as called for by the Council of Trent in 1563. In the Julian Calendar, as in the Hindu calendar, the new year began with the spring equinox around April 1.

People who were slow to get the news or failed to recognize that the start of the new year had moved to January 1 and continued to celebrate it during the last week of March through April 1 became the butt of jokes and hoaxes and were called "April fools." These pranks included having paper fish placed on their backs and

being referred to as "poisson d'avril" (April fish), said to symbolize a young, easily caught fish and a gullible person.
